Office for International Cooperation of the University of Zagreb where they were hosted by Renata Hranjec.










Day 6 (Wensday, June 19th 2019.)

In the morning hours, a student from the University of Cincinnati Ohio Saira Matthews, director of AAP Michael Aldarondo Jeffries from the University of Central Florida, professor Elliot Vittes from South Carolina, dr. Third day of simposium started with lecturing dr.sc. Nikola Kadoić and assoc.prof.dr.sc. Nina Begičević Ređep on the topis How to make right decision?. The day started with the presentation of the Master's program students from the FOI of the Economic Entrepreneurship in the Student House, and the topics were the Plitvica lakes - ICT Integration within UNESCO (Nikolina Landripet), the Cultural Heritage of Varaždin (Karlo Strahija) and the History of Zagreb (Karla Češković).

After a short pause has started the second part of the daily program - an intercultural game called Graduate Persuit Mistery Cards designed by YMCA Toronto. American and Croatian students and professors were formed into four-player teams. The game is played in a way that the players needs to throw a dice, and depending on the number they get, can move on the board. With each throw, player pulls out a card whith instructions for the next move. There are two types of cards: "Congratulations" (a positive case for a well-done job) and "Oh no!" (A

negative outcome indicating that a player in the role of a student has made the wrong move in a study life). The goal of the game is to reach the finish first and graduate.

Afternoon hours were reserved for team building. American and Croatian students went to visit Varaždin, and afterwards to the meadow in Old Town where they plaied various games such as badminton, volleyball, and frisbee. The evening was rounded off by going to dinner.















Day 8 (Friday, June 21th 2019.)

Last day of the Symposium was reserved for research presentation of students from University of Central Florida (UCF). Students Darwins Olcima, Chance Brewer and Bianca Pizzaro Vasquez brought up interesting and quality researches on which they were working with their mentors. After that, dr.sc. Boris Tomaš and Erasmus student William Thomas introduced us their presentations on topic "Why IOT? Because we can (Internet of Things)". Later, dr.sc. Mladen Koncecki had an workshop "How Computers Play Drums?" where he connected informatics and music lessons.

After lunch, we were ready for our Skype meeting with professor Andreia Carita from University of Applied Science from Amsterdam. She introduced US students to a project on which we were working for a past few months. Then, Master's students of Economics of entrepreneurship together with Erasmus students from France and students from Amsterdam presented their virtual project within course Negotiating in International Environment.
